All flushing takes place between 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. on the scheduled day.

Notes to Schedule:

- Watermains are flushed on a regular basis to clean the mains and ensure a fresh supply of water. Additional, unscheduled watermain flushing may be required occasionally.
- Some red discolouration of your water may become apparent immediately after the watermains in your area are flushed. This is iron, which is picked up naturally by the water in the aquifer underground, which settles out of the water in the watermains. Let your water run from your taps for a few minutes until the water clears up.
- We have set the schedule to minimize any inconvenience to you. If you have any questions or concerns about our watermain flushing program, do not hesitate to give OCWA a call at 1-866-775-7712 or (705) 429-2525, option 3.
- On the day that flushing occurs in your area, it is recommended to avoid using or minimize water usage. If you must use your water during flushing activities, you may encounter low water pressure, water discolouration or sediment that could cause staining or sediment in your laundry, appliances (i.e. dishwasher or ice machines), bathtubs or hot water tanks.**

Protect Your Pipes and Your Wallet!

BE CAREFUL WHAT GOES DOWN THE DRAIN

Baby wipes, dental floss, salad dressing and bacon grease. What do they all have in common?

These items can block your pipes if you put them down the sink or toilet.

Blocked pipes are big trouble. They can burst or back up, leading to **costly flooding** in your home or business.

Further down the line, items like wipes and grease can clog sewers and **cause toxic sewage overflows** into streets and the natural environment.

They can also **damage local wastewater infrastructure**, and your **water rates may go up** to cover repairs.

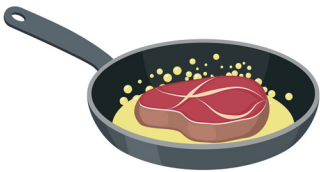


FATS, OILS & GREASE

Also known as FOG, fats, oils and grease are a **major cause of pipe blockages**. Some examples of FOG are:

- » *Meat fat*
- » *Butter, margarine*
- » *Sandwich spreads*
- » *Salad Dressings*
- » *Cooking oils*
- » *Milk, cream*
- » *Sauces, gravies*

TIP: After cooking, **allow FOG to cool and harden** in pans. Or pour liquid FOG into a heat-safe container such as a tin can to cool and harden. Then **scrape hardened FOG into the green bin or garbage, as directed by your municipality.** Use paper towels to wipe up excess FOG.



The 3 Ps

The **only things that go down the toilet are Pee, Poo and (toilet) Paper.** No exceptions.

No dental floss, facial tissue, condoms, feminine hygiene products, cotton swabs or cat litter. **Not even baby wipes** – just because something says it's flushable doesn't mean it is.



Some cooking oils don't harden. But they still stick to pipes. Small amounts can be absorbed in the green bin or garbage. Check with your municipality about how to dispose of larger amounts.

Drinking Water - Drinking Water Sources

Residents living in private dwellings can obtain their personal drinking water from different water sources such as surface water source, wells (drilled well, dug well, well point), cistern

Test Your Drinking Water

The Ontario Public Health Laboratories will test your water for bacteria (E. coli and total coliforms). This service is free for all private drinking water system owners (e.g. Wells that serve a single home or cottage).

Please note that municipal water is tested regularly by local municipalities. Water samples from a municipal supply are not analyzed by the Public Health Ontario Laboratories.

For all other water testing, including chemicals, please contact a privately owned licensed laboratory.

Smoking and Vaping Cessation Support

The health unit offers quit smoking and vaping services including consultation with a public health nurse, individual support throughout your quit period, no-cost nicotine replacement products & quick tips and information.

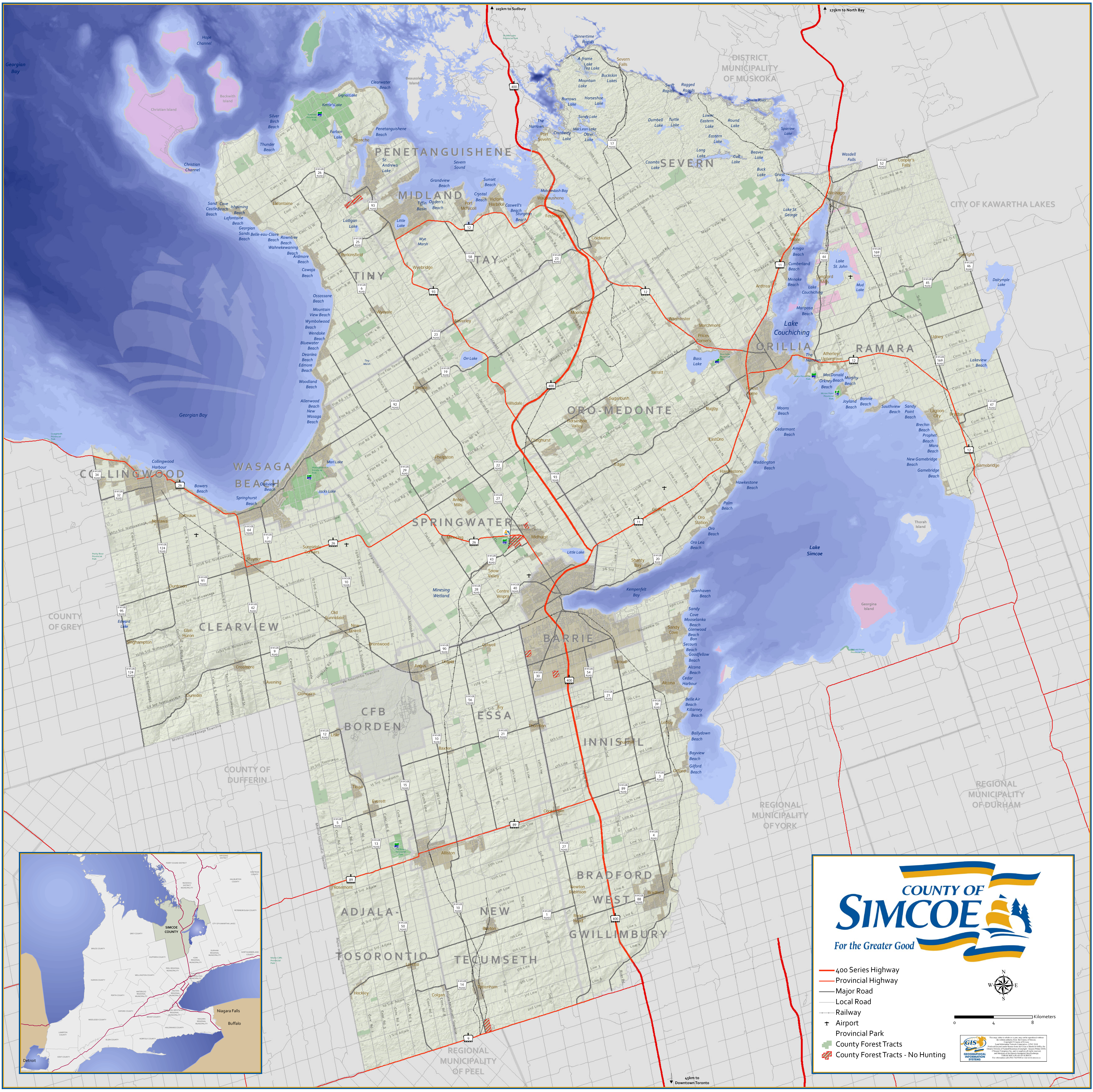








The cart request system is open!

Residents and businesses may swap their recycling and /or garbage carts for smaller ones. The first cart exchange/set of cart exchanges for each eligible County property is free of charge, until July 30, 2022. After this date, there will be a \$50 per cart administration fee applied.

It is important to consider your waste capacity needs carefully before switching size as the volume of waste produced changes considerably throughout the year; please make a note of your volumes to ensure you have the capacity for peak periods.

Please consider the following information prior to requesting an exchange:

- Requests can only be made by home/property-owners. Renters should contact their landlords for assistance
- Delivery of replacement carts may take several weeks. Please do NOT submit multiple online requests



- The County will coordinate delivery and exchange of your carts to your household/business. You will be notified prior to delivery to have your current EMPTY cart(s) at roadside for the exchange to occur
- Please carefully select the best size for your household. Overflow garbage must have a \$3 tag affixed. If smaller carts are selected (garbage or recycling) and the location has consistent overflow of materials or over-stuffed carts, the location will be required to revert to a larger size cart and the \$50 per cart administration fee will be applied.

- Paints and stains

- Pharmaceuticals
- Household cleaners

- Pesticides
- Fertilizers
- Propane tanks and cylinders
- Needles and syringes

Household hazardous waste can be disposed of safely and free of charge.

Ensure containers are clearly labelled, secured, and leak-proof. Never combine products and keep HHW materials separate from other materials in your load, as explosive or poisonous chemical reactions may occur.
